She needed gasoline to get to her son's side but had no way to afford it.

Thank goodness that at Christian Clearing House we have guidelines, not rigid rules and because of the generosity of our donors, we were able to give Becky a gas card so she could be with her son during that critical time.

Moments like this remind us why we do what we do. It is through your compassion and continued support that we can respond quickly and provide hope when it's needed most.

Message from our Executive Director

2025 has certainly kept CCH's Board and staff on our toes. The demand for assistance has continued to rise, surpassing even the already high numbers from 2024. Alongside this increase, we've seen a significant spike in requests for food assistance. As food prices soar and the cost of utilities and rent continue to climb, many of our most vulnerable neighbors are struggling to make ends meet. The recent government shutdown has only worsened the situation, impacting countless households here in Hancock County and across the nation. These challenges have made it increasingly difficult for families to afford even basic necessities, and we've seen firsthand how these economic pressures have deepened food insecurity in our community.

We are incredibly grateful for the vital support we've received from United Way of Hancock County and from our faithful donors who continue to respond with generosity and compassion. Your contributions enable us to provide emergency assistance to neighbors in crisis, offering not only financial relief but also hope and stability during uncertain times.

She consistently stays informed about the latest programs available to best assist our clients, ensuring we provide the most effective support possible. In May, we were also able to expand our team thanks to a grant from the Findlay-Hancock County Community Foundation. We welcomed Ashley Campbell as our Office Coordinator, and she has already made a meaningful difference through her kindness, compassion, and support for both clients and volunteers.

This year's Treasure Hunt for a Cause Benefit Sale was a tremendous success, thanks to the overwhelming support of our community, both through donations and participation. A special thank you to Brinkman's for their ongoing partnership with this annual event. We're already looking forward to the 2026 sale on March 14th–15th.

CCH also hosted the Sparkle & Shine Prom Dress Giveaway. We hope to expand this program in 2026, continuing to make a positive difference for local students.

In partnership with CedarCreek, we were able to distribute 1,300 backpacks filled with school supplies and 800 shoe vouchers to local children as the new school year began. Our Back-to-School Sock Drive, supported by local churches, was another highlight. The response was outstanding, providing enough socks for every backpack and even extras for families visiting our office. During the winter months, we also participated in Operation Warm, providing 252 new winter coats to children throughout Hancock County.

On a professional note, Heather and I participated in the Lilly School Organizational Strengthening Program and several AI training sessions this year. These opportunities have helped us strengthen our fundraising efforts and stay informed about the latest trends and tools shaping the nonprofit sector.

While it can be easy to feel removed from the hardships others face, the truth is that many of those we serve are hardworking individuals and families who have encountered unexpected financial setbacks. Many rely on Social Security or Disability benefits, and even a single unexpected expense, like a car repair or medical bill, can quickly lead to crisis. At CCH, we are honored to walk beside them, offering a helping hand when it's needed most.

As we look toward 2026, please continue to keep those who rely on our services in your thoughts and prayers. Your ongoing financial support is a true blessing, not only to CCH but to every neighbor who receives hope and help because of your generosity.

Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) provide you the opportunity to make withdrawals annually. If you'd like more information on the requirements, be sure to contact your tax preparer before year-end. But when it comes to withdrawals please consider:

Or consider setting up an endowment fund at The Findlay-Hancock Community Foundation in support of CCH. CCH also has established funds at the foundation that are open to deposit into.
